INTERVENTION SERVICES

Chemical Abuse Reduced by Education (C.A.R.E.) is a Compact-wide initiative to prevent substance abuse and promote healthy living and asset building in Compact schools. C.A.R.E. Committee members, including coordinators at the six high schools, work with community members and local laws enforcement personnel. The C.A.R.E. Appreciation Banquet is an annual event recognizing school and community supporters in the six districts.

Saturday Family Workshop, an intensive, family-based substance abuse program that provides an alternative consequence for school policy violations or a Juvenile Justice referral, continues to be an important C.A.R.E. service. Saturday Family Workshop is offered to families, including families of middle school students, at no cost. Saturday Family Workshop is also offered for middle school students. Saturday Family Anger Management, an intensive family-based program offered as an alternative consequence of a school policy violation. This is a school-based intervention model with a helping perspective for families dealing with inappropriate actions as a result of anger. This program is offered to families with middle school and high school students.

Compact Career Program students can take advantage of the **Student Learner Success Intervention Service**, which provides one-on-one instruction for students who need individualized tutoring for any academic and career classes, as well as for standardized tests. Student Learner specialists also offer students assistance in preparing Career Passports, resumes and other tools.
