What is a career assessment?

Students may be asked to do a sample job application, mock interview, interest surveys, online assessment tools and other related tasks. Accommodations and modifications will be addressed throughout the assessment process. Work aptitudes and behaviors are assessed. This information is used to determine the strengths and areas of needed improvement related to career planning. This data is included in the comprehensive report.

What is in the report?

- General information about the student, as well as specific worker characteristics.
- Comparisons to specific Compact Career-Technical Education programs or job situations.
- Employability and behavior skills.
- Suggestions for placement and referrals.

How is the report used?

Results are presented at a conference with the student, parent or guardian and are given to appropriate school personnel to be used for future career and academic planning.
