# **Credit Options / Definitions**

### **Advanced Placement**

- Through AP's college-level courses and exams in high school, students can earn college credit and advanced placement standing.
- Most four-year colleges in the United States and colleges in more than 60 other countries give students credit, advanced placement or both on the basis of AP Exam scores.

### **Articulated / Bilateral Credit**

- College credit that is available through a written agreement (Bi-Lateral Articulation Agreement) between a secondary school and a college/university.
- Articulated Credit is awarded to students who successfully complete a high school course/program, meet the requirements of the Articulation Agreement and matriculate on to the college/university partner.
- This credit is typically not easily transferrable to additional institutions as it is a unique agreement between two specific institutions.

## **College Credit Plus**

- Signed into law June 16, 2014
- Replaces all PSEO and Dual Enrollment programs
- Establishes a funding structure
- Students MUST be <u>dually enrolled with actual credit</u>
- Public schools MUST participate.
- No eligible student can be denied access.

### **Credit By Exam**

- Students may receive credit for an course by taking an examination in place of the actual course. Some exams can be taken prior to admission to a public institution of higher education.
- Eligible high school students can take these exams and grades are reported after high school graduation and matriculation to the partner institution.

### Certification

- Students have the potential to earn college credit through the certifications that they obtain during high school
- Very specific to the individual Higher Education Institution. Could be a course to course match or a block technical credit match.

#### **CTAG** - Career Technical Assurance Guides

- CTAGs are groups of technical courses that represent a commonly accepted pathway to an associate degree.
- Courses or course sequences identified as being a part of the CTAG may be accepted at any approved public higher education institution in Ohio.
- CTAG courses, once transcripted, are transferrable between public higher education institutions in Ohio.

# **Early College High School**

- Early college high school is a bold approach, based on the principle that academic rigor, combined with the opportunity to save time and money, is a powerful motivator for students to work hard and meet serious intellectual challenges
- Early college high schools blend high school and college in a rigorous yet supportive program, compressing the time it takes to complete a high school diploma and the first two years of college
- The schools are designed so that low-income youth, firstgeneration college goers, English language learners, students of color, and other young people underrepresented in higher education can simultaneously earn a high school diploma and an associate degree or up to two years of credit toward a bachelor degree—tuition free

### **International Baccalaureate**

- High quality program for students that assists in developing their intellectual, personal, emotional and social skills.
- Focus on living, learning and working in a rapidly globalizing world.
- Encourages international mindness and a positive attitude toward working.
- IB tests may have college credit attached to them.
