What is MCTMP?

The 2021-2022 school year marks the inaugural year for the Modern Communication Through Media Production program! This two-year program is designed for creative, critical thinkers who want to utilize and develop their ability to initiate and produce video and audio broadcasts by displaying leadership, and collaborating with their fellow students. Students will utilize the latest in interactive technology, social media and software while gaining real-world skills and experience to create a professional portfolio.

In each year of the program, students will spend a semester at Hudson High School where their focus will be on video broadcasting, and the other semester will be spent at Cuyahoga Falls High School focusing on audio broadcasting. Additionally, students will complete coursework in Media Arts Writing, Business of Arts Communication and college-preparatory English.

Academic Update

MCTMP students are finishing their first semester of the program, which was spent at Cuyahoga Falls High School under the direction of instructors **Brent Hovey** (Audio Broadcasting) and **Joe Nowak** (Media Arts Writing). Students will start their second semester at Hudson High School, where **Mike Ondash** (Video Broadcasting) and **Stefanie Crecelius** (Media Arts) look forward to instructing this fantastic group of pioneering students!

Brent Hovey states that this group of students are doing a "tremendous job" and are truly "setting the foundation" for a program with enormous potential. Brent shares that the students have been working on the basics of audio broadcasting, journalism fundamentals and sound production. Students work on daily radio newscasts, which are sent over and aired on 96.1 FM. They work extensively on Adobe Audition to record and edit their projects.

After just a few short weeks into the school year, the students set their sights on a lofty goal - the development of a podcast. The students created *The 330*, a podcast born from their creative minds that covers topics related to school and the cities within the Six District Educational Compact.

As the year progressed, the students were inspired to show others the inner workings of both the program and their podcast through a documentary, *Making the 330*. The documentary production is in full swing with the first trailer released in November and the full film set anticipated to be completed by January 2022.

Students hear from and interview media entrepreneur

Nick Pedone, social media and podcast entrepreneur, stopped by Cuyahoga Falls High School and spoke to MCTMP students in December. Nick graduated from Nordonia High School in 2016 and Kent State University in 2020. After completing an internship with ESPN Cleveland, he went on to create two of his own podcasts - Big Play Sports and Pedone My Take. At only 22 years old, he has already established himself as a well-known figure amongst the Cleveland professional sports scene. Nick spoke to the class about the opportunities in the field of podcast and content creation. Nick delivered the important message surrounding taking advantage of opportunities and creating your own opportunities. The students were impressed with Nick's success at such a young age. Nick sat in on a segment of *The 330* podcast. Stow-Munroe Falls senior Koby Slusser talked with Nick in his latest installment of "Swivel Sports with Koby" and the two had a blast recording the segment.
