Compact History 1969-2023

1969

 Six superintendents propose a regionalized approach for meeting new vocational mandates. State vocational education officials doubt it will work, but State Superintendent Martin Essex grants approval, calling it an "exemplary idea" which might serve as a model for other districts.

1970 - 1975

- Agreement is signed between Cuyahoga Falls, Hudson, Kent, Stow, Tallmadge and Woodridge school districts.
- **Dr. Robert Stanton**, Kent superintendent, is chosen to be the first chairman with **Dr. Harold Wilson**, following as the second.
- Administrative intern from Kent State University hired as coordinator.
- Eldon Reiboldt is hired as the Compact's first full-time executive director.

1976-1980

- Compact services expanded to include special education, a career assessment center, graduate follow-up studies, summer school and audio-visual repair service.
- Chemical Abuse Reduced by Education (CARE) committee established with district and community representatives.

1981-1985

- Mary Jane Stanchina is hired as the Compact's new executive director.
- CTE / Special Education Coordinator position was created.

1986-1990

- Career programs were revised to address changes in the job market.
- Reading and math intervention, career and professional development, computer repair services, GRADS, OPTION 4, GED testing, proficiency test preparation, adult education, shared business services, and JOGS, 1985-1995

1991-1995

• The first Career Passports were issued to 107 eligible students.

1996-2000

- The Manufacturing and Pre-Engineering Academy, the Compact's first Tech Prep initiative, held its first classes at Roosevelt and Stow-Munroe Falls.
- Urban Forestry/Landscape Horticulture opened at Roosevelt.

2001-2005

- A+ Certification and Networking (replaced CISCO) and Banking and Financial Services opened at Cuyahoga Falls High School.
- Collision Repair and Auto Refinishing opened in downtown Cuyahoga Falls for Woodridge.
- CAD-CAM, Athletic Health Care and Fitness and Teaching Professions opened at Roosevelt.
- A Health foundations course was established at Roosevelt, the first offering in the Health Science and Technology Pathway.

2006-2010

- Project SEARCH opens in partnership with Summa Health.
- Early Childhood Professions opens as Tallmadge's first program open to Compact students.
- Auto Technology at Cuyahoga Falls reopens.
- Aviation Careers Academy launches at Stow-Munroe Falls.
- Theater Arts Careers Academy opens at Tallmadge.

2011-2015

- Biomedical Engineering and Technology Academy opens at Woodridge.
- Criminal Justice launches at Cuyahoga Falls.
- Programming and Software Development opens at Stow-Munroe Falls.

2016-2020

- Several new middle school CTE initiatives were developed, allowing students to experience various career fields.
- EntrepreNew Pathways opened in Woodridge.

2021-Today

- Industrial Maintenance and Production for Employment opens at Stow-Munroe Falls.
- Community Agriculture for Local Impact will launch during the 2023-2024 school year.
